THE TEST THAT OPENS DOORS AROUND THE WORLD

IELTS or 'International English Language Testing System' is an international standardized test of English language proficiency.

IELTS has two versions of the test:

The Academic Version is intended for those who want to enroll in universities
and other institutions of higher education and for professionals such as medical
doctors and nurses who want to study or practice in an English-speaking
country.



2. The General Version is intended for those planning to undertake non-academic training or to gain work experience, or for immigration purposes. It is generally acknowledged that the reading and writing tests for the Academic Version are more difficult than those for the General Training Version, due to the differences in the level of intellectual and academic rigor between the two versions.

Reading, Writing and Listening sections are completed in one day. Depending on test centre, the Speaking test may be offered on the same day or up to a week before or after the other parts.

IELTS provides a profile of a candidate's ability to use English. Candidates receive scores on a Band Scale from 1 to 9. A score is reported for each module of the test. The individual module scores are then averaged and rounded to produce an Overall Band Score according to a confidential band score conversion table. Overall Band Scores and Listening and Reading scores are reported in whole and half Bands; Writing and Speaking Band Scores are reported in whole Bands only. Dr Amit Parashar




