Mental ability means how strong is our mental system or simply mental ability shows how fast we can think new The power to learn or retain knowledge; in law, the ability to understand the facts and significance of your behavior capacity and intelligence quotient are related, and in some ways opposite views of human mental ability. Whereas intelligence quotient sees intelligence as being a single measurable characteristic affecting all mental



ability, aptitude refers to one of many different characteristics which can be independent of each other, such as aptitude for military flight, air traffic control, or computer programming. This is more similar to the theory of multiple intelligences. A very general mental capability that, among other things, involves the ability to reason, plan, solve problems, think abstractly, comprehend complex ideas, learn quickly and learn from experience. It is not merely book learning, a narrow academic skill, or test-taking smarts. Rather, it reflects a broader and deeper capability for comprehending our surrounding catching on, making sense of things, or "figuring out what to do. Mental ability is the use of response time in perceptual-motor tasks to infer the content, duration, and temporal sequencing of cognitive operations. Mental chronometry is one of the core paradigms of experimental and cognitive psychologyy, and has found application in various disciplines including cognitive psychophysiology/cognitive neurosciencee and behavioral neurosciencee to elucidate mechanisms underlying cognitive processing. Concerning a single measurable characteristic affecting all mental ability, analysis of any group of intelligence test scores will nearly always show them to be highly correlated.

The mental ability is tested of the candidates appearing for the various competitive exams, like NDA entrance test, CAT, MAT, SBI PO examination, CDS, SCRA, Income Tax Inspectors examination, LIC Administrative Officers examination and the various civil services examinations.
