CLOUD COMPUTING

Cloud computing provides computation, software, data access, and storage services that do not require end-user knowledge of the physical location and configuration of the system that delivers the services. Parallels to this concept can be drawn with the electricity grid, wherein end-users consume power without needing to understand the component devices or infrastructure required to provide the service. The concept of cloud computing fills a perpetual need of IT: a way to increase capacity or add capabilities on the fly without investing in new infrastructure, training new personnel, or licensing new software. Cloud computing encompasses any subscription-based or pay-per-use service that, in real time over the Internet, extends IT's existing capabilities. Cloud computing describes a new supplement, consumption, and delivery model for IT services based on Internet protocols, and it typically involves provisioning of dynamically scalable and often virtualized resources. It is a by-product and consequence of the ease-of-access to remote computing sites provided by the Internet. This may take the form of web-based tools or applications that users can access and use through a web browser as if they were programs installed locally on their own computers. Most cloud computing infrastructures consist of services delivered through shared data-centers and appearing as a single point of access for consumers' computing needs. Commercial offerings may be required to meet service-level agreements (SLAs), but specific terms are less often negotiated by smaller companies.

TOEIC : A KEY TO GLOBAL JOB MARKET

TOEIC is an acronym that stands for Test of English for International Communication. Universities and professional schools throughout the world are facing the challenge of preparing, placing and competing for graduates. Schools, such as Hardayal Technical Campus in Mathura, not only need to prepare their students for the requirements of their chosen professions, but also need to ensure the quality of their staff and programs. That requires a certain measure of English fluency as it is used in the international workplace.

Types of Test: The Listening and Reading test is a paper and pencil test that takes 2.5 hours and is taken at a test centre. The Speaking and Writing test is an online test that is taken in a test centre and takes 90 minutes.

Test Centers: Ahmedabad, Bengal, Chennai, Delhi NCR, Hyderabad, Kolkata, Mumbai, and Pune

Eligibility: Graduate with basic, intermediate or advanced functional fluency that meets standards international.

Purpose: To work in the international workplace.

Test Pattern: The entire test is four hours long and all section are taken on the same day.

Listening Comprehension: 100

Photographs: 10 questions ; Question-Response: 30 questions ; Conversations: 30 questions ; 10 conversations with 3 questions each ; Short Talks: 30 questions ; 10 talks with 3 questions each

Reading Comprehension : 100

Incomplete Sentences: 40 questions ; Text Completion: 12 questions ; Single Passages: 28 questions ; 7-10 reading texts with 2-5 questions each ; Double Passages: 20 questions ; 4 pairs of reading texts with 5 questions per pair.

Speaking (30 minutes)

The test is taken online and your voice is recorded and sent to be marked. Scores arrive in 3 to 4 weeks.

You have to do the following tasks: read a paragraph aloud (tests pronunciation) ; describe a picture (tests vocabulary/grammar) ; respond to recorded questions (tests fluency/extended discourse) ; propose a solution ; express an opinion

Writing (60 minutes)

The test is taken online and sent to be marked. Scores arrive in 3 to 4 weeks.

You have to do the following tasks:

Write sentences about pictures; Write an email response ; Write an essay

Due to non practicability, Quiz on last page does not cover Listening and Speaking sections. It will be participated during PDP Classes.
