The whole world is moving towards knowledge economy. Goldman Sachs's famous BRICS report of 2003 product depicts that India will become one of the top five economies of the world by 2050. In another global economics paper, it has also identified 'raise basic education achievement and increase quality and quantity of universities as two of its top three things that India needs

to do in order to achieve this status.

Opportunities before us are immense and the task is onerous. India graduates more than five million graduates every year and the availability of jobs are limited. A report by aspiring minds put following valuable points:

- 47% graduates not employed in any sector of the knowledge economy.
  - Less females are pursuing three year graduates degrees and show similar or higher employability to males.
  - English and computer skills dampening smaller town employability prospects significantly.
  - Education system promoting role learning in place of actual application of concepts.
  - Over 40% employable graduates beyond the top 30% colleges have no way to signal their employability to potential recruiters.

# Competition

Competition is a contest between two or more organisms, animals, individuals, groups, etc., for territory, a niche, for a location of resources, for resources and goods, for mates, for prestige, for recognition, for awards, for group or social status, or for leadership. Competition is the opposite of cooperation. It arises whenever at least two parties strive for a goal which cannot be shared or which is desired individually but not in sharing and cooperation. Competition occurs naturally between living organisms which co-exist in the same environment.

Competition can have both beneficial and detrimental effects. Many evolutionary biologists view inter-species and intra-species competition as the driving force of adaptation, and ultimately of evolution.

Three levels of economic competition have been classified:

The most narrow form is direct competition (also called category competition or brand
competition), where products which perform the same function compete against each other. For
example, one brand of pick-up trucks competes with several other brands of pick-up trucks.
Sometimes, two companies are rivals and one adds new products to their line, which leads to the
other company distributing the same new things, and in this manner they compete.

The next form is substitute or indirect competition, where products which are close substitutes for one another compete. For example, butter competes with margarine, mayonnaise and other various sauces and spreads.

The broadest form of competition is typically called budget competition. Included in this category is anything on which the consumer might want to spend their available money. For example, a family which has \$20,000 available may choose to spend it on many different items, which can all be seen as competing with each other for the family's expenditure. This form of competition is also sometimes described as a competition of "share of wallet".


